



FIRST AID POLICY

PURPOSE

To ensure the school community understands our school's approach to first aid for students.

SCOPE

First aid for anaphylaxis and asthma are provided for in our school's:

- *Anaphylaxis Policy*
- *Asthma Policy*

POLICY

From time to time Glenallen School staff might need to administer first aid to students at school or school activities.

Parents/carers should be aware that the goal of first aid is not to diagnose or treat a condition.

Staffing

The principal will ensure that Glenallen School has sufficient staff with the appropriate levels of first aid training to meet the first aid needs of the school community.

Our school's trained first aid officers are listed in our Emergency Management Plan (EMP). Our EMP includes the expiry dates of the training.

This list is reviewed on an annual basis as part of the annual review of our Emergency Management Plan.

First aid kits

Glenallen School will maintain:

1. A major First Aid kit (Emergency trolley) which will be stored in Sick Bay
2. Portable First Aid Kits are stored in the Pool Office, Glenallen School Buses, Administration Office
3. Six portable first aid kits which may be used for excursions, camps, or yard duty. These portable first aid kit/s will be stored in Sick Bay.

The School Nurse will be responsible for maintaining all First Aid kits.

Emergency Anaphylaxis and Asthma Kits

Glenallen School will maintain:

- Blue Asthma kits are wall mounted in each of the 3 sub schools (outside T18, library entrance & P8)
- Anaphylaxis kits are wall mounted in each of the 3 sub schools (outside T18, library entrance & P8).

Resuscitation Masks

Glenallen School will maintain:

- Nineteen Resuscitation masks are distributed around the school corridors.

Care for ill students

Students who are unwell should not attend school.

If a student becomes unwell during the school day they may be directed to the sick bay and monitored by nursing staff. Depending on the nature of their symptoms, nurses may contact parents/carers or an emergency contact person to ask them to collect the student.

First aid management

If there is a situation or incident which occurs at school or a school activity which requires first aid to be administered to a student:

- Staff who have been trained in first aid will administer first aid in accordance with their training. In an emergency situation, other staff may assist in the administration of first aid within their level of competence.
- In a medical emergency, staff may take emergency action and do not need to obtain parent/carer consent to do so. Staff may contact Triple Zero “000” for emergency medical services at any time.
- Staff may also contact NURSE-ON-CALL (on 1300 60 60 24) in an emergency. NURSE-ON-CALL provides immediate, expert health advice from a registered nurse and is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.
- If first aid is administered for a minor injury or condition, Glenallen School will notify parents/carers by a phone call or message in student’s diary.
- If first aid is administered for a serious injury or condition, or in an emergency situation, school staff will attempt to contact parents/carers or emergency contacts as soon as reasonably practical.
- If staff providing first aid determine that an emergency response is not required but that medical advice is needed, school staff will ask parents/carers, or an emergency contact person, to collect the student and recommend that advice is sought from a medical practitioner.
- Whenever first aid treatment has been administered to a student Glenallen will:
 - record the incident on CASES21 and/or the Registered Nurses will record the incident in their medical notes. These notes will record incident and treatment management.
 - if first aid was administered in a medical emergency, follow the Department’s [Reporting and Managing School Incidents Policy](#), including reporting the incident to the Department’s Incident Support and Operations Centre on 1800 126 126.

In accordance with guidance from the Department of Education and Training, analgesics, including paracetamol and aspirin, will not be provided as a standard first aid treatment. This is because they can mask signs of serious illness or injury.

COMMUNICATION

This policy will be communicated to our school community in the following ways:

- Available publicly on our school’s website
- Included in staff induction processes and staff training
- Hard copy available from school administration upon request.
